& Credits	Quarter is 10-weeks, followed by a Final Exam week. For the
	conversion of quarter credits to your home institution, please see

	Students may register for 12-18 credits per quarter for full-time
	status. UW courses can range from 1-5 credits each. Most ECON
	courses are 5 credits each. Average credit load is around 15 credits
	per quarter.
	International students are required to have 12 credits registered for
	each academic quarter of study.
	One 5-credit course means that there are approximately 5 classroom
	hours per week, for 10 weeks.
