Available exchange programs:

More important details:

- Primarily open to Economics majors. Students in other majors can apply, but will be considered on a space-available basis.
- Completion of ECON 300 and ECON 301 prior to departure is required. Proficiency in German required for program at LMU. Proficiency in French required for program at Aix-Marseille University.
- As these exchanges are with economics programs at peer institutions, most coursework will be taken in the exchange university's equivalent of the UW Department of Economics.
- Peer institutions operate on a semester-system. (In most cases, 1 semester credit abroad can be approved as 1.5 quarter credits at UW; unless on the ECTS System, where 1 ECTS credits = 0.75 UW credits.)
- UW students will pay UW tuition while studying abroad. Additional costs include IPE fees, airfare, visas, insurance, and other general travel costs.
